Re: Ice Throwing Hazard from Wind Turbines

Dear Mathew,


Confirming our conversation, we have never experienced nor heard of a situation where ice was thrown from a wind turbine blade causing property damage and/or bodily injury. We've been doing commercial insurance since 1972 and have specialized in the renewable energy industries since 2000 and have insured many wind energy projects throughout the US. Our experience is that we simply don't view ice being thrown from a wind turbine blade to be a significant possibility.

We carried this question forward with underwriters at Hartford Insurance Company, who have been a solid, nation-wide insurance provider of general liability insurance for wind energy projects. They also stated that they are not aware of any circumstances of a general liability claim resulting from an ice throwing incident. They confirm that icing on wind turbine blades is not a likely event that could lead to a general liability claim. Nonetheless, should such an event occur, their comprehensive policy would protect you, the developer and operator.
