## Project Update

Preliminary designs for the Allegany Project are in progress. As some of you have seen, survey stakes marking potential windpark facilities have been placed throughout the project area. A Noble representative will be in touch soon to review those survey stakes to make certain you are comfortable with Noble's design plans. Your input is important to us and we welcome your suggestions.

Noble's next step is to submit an application to the town to begin the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) process. Once submitted, Noble will prepare a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS), which the town will review and ultimately accept. We appreciate your support throughout the process.
